
cussing on our mental health and naming ond recognising our feeling and what to do if we are sad or angry. Chinese New Year was celebrated through stories, food and dancing

Clothing

Please ensure your child arrives at playgroup in appropriate clothing

for a fun, messy, outdoor, indoor, painting, gluing, playdough, water, shaving foam, cornflour, lots of fun kind of day! In this weather they should have a warm coat and sensible shoes (useable inside and outside) as we do go outside in all weathers unless it is really inclement. We have a supply of St John's fleeces, rain trousers

and jackets which the children can grab in their haste to go outside and a stock of wellington boots if it is really wet with puddles. You could bring your child's Wellies, clearly named please. Change of clothes



Can you also bring a change of clothes for your child in a small bag (drawstring gym bags are ideal

for hanging 'low' on the peg, allowing room for the coat above).

If children use playgroups clothes and underwear i.e. if they have an 'accident' please could you wash and return the loaned clothes as soon as possible.

A ny outgrown clothes would be greatly appreciated please, particularly girls leg-ins and boys track bottoms and pants (for easy handling at toilet time.)
