
count, sort and arrange natural shapes. We will look at the different shapes of leaves and try to work out which tree they come from.

The British Nutrition Foundation (BNF) has published its updated 5532 guide, a resource about

portion size and healthy eating focussed on toddlers, which includes new information on free sugars, and more advice on vegetarian and vegan diets for young children, aged 1-4 years.

Mini me's

We will reintroduce Mini Me's to the children. So if they tell you they

have a picture of themselves on a little wooden block—that's the mini me. It means they can take 'themselves' into play. They can be the train driver, the hero, the mummy, daddy, brother or sister while playing with other small world characters. We also found out that if your child's best friend isn't it, they can just borrow their mini me to play with. A really popular addition to their play.

Choking Choking is a real danger for young children who not only put food in their mouth and may not chew it, but also small toys. At our recent Food

may not chew it, but also small toys. At our recent Food Hygiene visit there was a big focus on what we do to avoid children choking. He was very impressed at how closely supervised the children are during lunch and snack. With all staff also having full paediatric first aid and know how to deal with choking incidents. Please see the attached posters for more information about how you can avoid choking incidents at home and how to treat a child who is choking.
